12.30 - 13.00: Registration and Welcome address - Dr Serena O Connell

Dr Serena O Connell is the current President of the Irish Student Health Association, and a GP in the Student Health Unit in University of Galway.

13.00 - 13.45: ACT for Meningitis - Siobhán Carroll

ACT for Meningitis was set up in 2011 by Siobhan and Noel Carroll following the tragic loss of their daughter Aoibhe, aged just 4, to meningitis. Their mission is to raise awareness, to promote education and to provide support to those affected by meningitis in Ireland They also run various National Annual Awareness Campaigns in crèches, schools, colleges, clubs, and workplaces, and provide free Meningitis Training Programmes to pharmacies and medical professionals.

13.45 - 14.30: "Hidradenitis Suppurativa" A clinical update – Dr Barry McGrath

Dr Barry McGrath has been living with hidradenitis suppurativa (HS) for over 30 years and has witnessed dramatic changes in HS care, research, and treatment in that period. Barry uses his extensive lived experience as an HS advocate and patient research partner with HS researchers in Ireland and internationally. He co-founded and manages HS Ireland, an association for people affected by HS living in Ireland, comprising approx. 1200 people with HS and their families, partners, and carers, and also includes healthcare professionals and others. He enjoys communicating HS-related information to various audiences. Barry is a former scientific researcher and university lecturer and currently works with a contract research organisation.

A local pharmacist from Galway city will discuss the recent shortages in the supply of many medicines. He will then take questions from the delegates.

In 2014 Jack gave the acclaimed TEDx Talk "Fearless Like a Child, Overcoming Adversity" and in 2019 was awarded as one of "Ten Outstanding Young People of The Year". Jack has also received several international awards for his documentary Breaking Boundaries. As a Pharmacist, Speaker and Facilitator Jack is passionate about the value of health & wellbeing as drivers for business performance coupled with cultivating diverse & inclusive environments where people belong and are valued.

Jack is host of the 'Only Human Podcast' and sits on the board of directors of the National Disability Authority and Centre for Excellence in Universal Design as well as leadership development organisation Common Purpose Ireland.
